AN ORDER ADOPTING THE EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 7 s. 2022 OF THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OF DAVAO DEL SUR THE GUIDELINES UNDER ALERT LEVEL 3 OF THE IATF ALERT LEVEL SYSTEM FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF HAGONOY, DAVAO DEL SUR

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that the local governments units shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, including the promotion of health and safety of the people;

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2021, President Rodrigo Duterte issued Executive Order No. 151, Series of 2021 mandating the implementation of the Alert Level System of the IATF in all areas of the country;

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2022, the IATF issued Resolution No. 157-A placing the entire Province of Davao del Sur under Alert Level 3;

WHEREAS, the continued vigilance, formulation and implementation of local issuances on COVID-19 and other proactive measures are necessary to slow down the surge of cases and limit, if not stop, further spread of COVID-19 variants in the Province of Davao del Sur;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FRANCO MAGNO CALIDA, Municipal Mayor of Hagonoy, Davao del Sur, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby ORDER the following:

SECTION 1. GUIDELINES UNDER ALERT LEVEL 3. The following protocols shall be observed in all Barangays in the municipality, except in areas thereof that may be subsequently placed under granular lockdown:

1. Provided, that those below eighteen (18) years of age, and those belonging vulnerable population, shall be allowed access to obtain essential goods and services, or for work in permitted industries and offices in accordance with existing rules, and regulations. Individual outdoor exercises shall also be allowed for all ages regardless of comorbidities or vaccination status.

2. The following establishments and/or activities characterized as high-risk for transmission shall not be allowed to operate:

a. Face to face or in-person classes for basic education, except those previously approved by the IATF and/or the Office of the President;

b. Contact sports, except those conducted under a bubble-type setup as provided for under relevant guidelines adopted by the IATF, Games and Amusement Board, and Philippine Sports Commission;

c. Funfairs/peryas and kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;

d. Venues with live voice and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, and theaters;

e. Cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President; and

f. Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.

3. The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate or be undertaken at a maximum of 30% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals only and 50% outdoor venue capacity. Provided, that all on-site workers/employees of these establishments, or organizers of activities are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and Minimum Health Standards under Provincial Ordinance No. 20-53, Series of 2020, shall be strictly maintained.

- a. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions;
- b. Permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers;
- c. Visitor or tourist attractions such as galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like;
- d. Amusement parks or theme parks;
- e. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, swimming pools, and similar venues;
- f. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technical-vocational education and training;
- g. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;
- h. Dine-in services in food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols;
- i. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI;

4. Agencies and instrumentalities of the government shall remain to be fully operational and shall adhere to at least a 60% on-site workforce. Those assigned to work off-site shall be subject to alternative work arrangements as approved by the head of agency in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC). Heads of agencies providing health and emergency frontline services, laboratory and testing services, border control, or other critical services shall operate at a workforce beyond the minimum as may be necessary to deliver their mandates.

5. Minimum Public Health Standards under Provincial Ordinance No. 20-53, Series of 2020, on social distancing and wearing face masks shall be strictly maintained; and,

6. Scanning of DS-CCTS QR Codes, as per Provincial Ordinance No. 20-60, Series of 2020, shall be strictly observed in all public and private establishments.

SECTION 2. REGULATIONS FOR UNVACCINATED INDIVIDUALS IN THE MUNICIPALITY. Unvaccinated individuals shall:

1. Remain in their residences and may be allowed mobility for the procurement of essential goods and services such as, but not limited to food, water, medicine, work and medical necessities;

2. Be allowed to take public transportation in pursuance of procuring goods and services as mentioned in paragraph 1 hereof;

3. Be required to undergo RT-PCR test once every two (2) weeks at their personal expense and present a negative COVID-19 result prior to being admitted to work. Unvaccinated individuals who reside outside of the municipality but who work and travel to the municipality shall also be required to submit a similar negative RT-PCR result;

SECTION 3. REGULATIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENTS AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT PROVIDERS. All establishments and public transport shall require all clients and passengers to present vaccination cards or, if not available, sufficient proof and justify the individuals access to goods and/or services.

SECTION 4. IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ORDER. The law enforcement agencies in coordination with the Barangays', and Municipal IATF shall take the lead in the implementation of these guidelines.


SECTION 5. PENALTIES. Any violation of these guidelines shall constitute non-cooperation of the person or entities and is punishable under Section 9 (d) or (e), as the case may be, of Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act, local ordinances, and other related laws.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part, section, or provision of these Guidelines is held invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE. Previous issuances or parts thereof in conflict with or inconsistent to the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
