REORGANIZING THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF HAGONUY, DAVAO DEL SUR AND FURTHER EXPANDING ITS COMPOSITION

WHEREAS, the Municipal Peace and Order Council (MPOC) is a unified and strongly coordinated body to carry out programs addressed to the current problems of insurgency, rebellion, criminality, terrorism, or disruption of public order which threaten the peace and order situation of locality;

WHEREAS, the MPOC is committed to ensure the prevention and maintenance of peace and order as the foundation for development and stability of the municipality;

WHEREAS, in adherence to Executive Order No. 773 reorganizing the Peace and Order Council where the council is directed at establishing and maintaining a system of coordinating government efforts and citizen's participation in the promotion, preservation and maintenance of peace and order in the locality.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Hagonoy through Executive Order No. 25 series of 2019 has reorganized its MPOC;

WHEREAS; upon through considerations guided by the DILG MC No. 2019-143 dated Aug. 27, 2019 re Omnibus Guidelines for Peace and Order Councils (POCs), the council needs to be re-organized following the stipulations therein;

NOW THEREFOR, I, FRANCO MAGNO CALIDA, Municipal Mayor of Hagonoy, Davao del Sur, by virtue of the power vested in me by pertinent laws, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. REORGANIZATION OF THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL (MPOC). The organized Municipal Peace and Order Council of Hagonoy, Davao del Sur shall be constituted as follows, viz.:

SECTION 2. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL. The Municipal Peace and Order Council shall have the following duties and functions, viz;

- a. Convene the Peace and Order Council quarterly or often as the need arises;
- b. Adopt the following resolutions:
 1. A resolution on the composition of the MPOC immediately after the assumption of the new chairperson, and in the event that there is any change in the composition thereof;
 2. A resolution on the creation of Special Action Committees;
 3. An annual resolution on the schedule of the quarterly meetings;
 4. A resolution on the composition of the MPOC Secretariat;
 5. A resolution on the approval of the MPOC POPS Plan;
 6. Such other resolution, as may be necessary.
- c. Invite other concerned agencies, not included in E.O 773, S. 2019, (e.g. intelligence communities or agencies) to join or participate in POC meetings and/or activities, as may be necessary;
- d. Formulate a **3-year Local Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPS Plan)**, to be incorporated/ and consistent with the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP);
- e. Create a **Special Action Committee (SAC)** on Anti-Insurgency and Anti-Criminality Crisis Management, and other SACs, to prevent or address the issues or incidents on peace and order and public safety;
- f. Create a Technical Working Group (TWG) for the purpose of POPS Planning following the guidelines prescribed by the Omnibus and other DILG Issuances on the tools and processes on POPS Planning;
- g. Provide a forum for inter-disciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and concerns affecting peace and order and public safety within their respective areas of jurisdiction;
- h. Recommend strategic actions or activities aimed at promoting, improving, or enhancing peace and order and public safety within their respective areas of jurisdictions;
- i. Recommend measures to converge and orchestrate internal security operations efforts of civil authorities and agencies, military, and police;
- j. Formulate and adopt an effective mechanism for the coordination, cooperation, and consultation involving the local chief executives, citizenry, and law enforcement agencies under RA 6975, as amended, in adoption of the Community and Service-Oriented Policing (CSOP) System;

- k. Apply moral suasion to and/or recommend sanctions against local chief executives who are giving materials and political support to the insurgents;
- l. Monitor provision of livelihood and infrastructure development programs and projects in the remote rural and indigenous population areas to isolate them from the insurgents ideological, political, and organizational works.
- m. Serve as the convergence mechanism to support the Enhance Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) Committee in its implementation, at the Municipal Level;
- n. Support the implementation of ELCAC initiatives;
- o. Participate in the conduct of annual POC Performance Audit;
- p. Provide regular staff and financial assistance from the MPOC Chairperson to support the MPOC Secretariat;
- q. Perform such other functions as may directed by law or higher authorities.

SECTION 3. MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL SECRETARIAT. There shall be Municipal Peace and Order Council Secretariat, composed of the following:

SECTION 4. ROLES AND FUNCTIONS OF MPOC SECRETARIAT. The MPOC Secretariat shall perform the following:

- a. The MPOC Secretariat Head shall cause the reorganization of the MPOC upon assumption of the new POC Chairperson after a national and local election through the following:
 - 1. Review of accredited CSO profiles related to Peace and Order and Public Safety
 - 2. Endorse and recommend CSO nominees to the MPOC Chair;
 - 3. Facilitate the request for security clearance of the appointed CSO;
- b. Assist the Chairperson in the conduct of MPOC meeting;
- c. Provide technical assistance in the performance of administrative and technical task of the MPOC.
- d. Recommend and prepare MPOC agenda and other required documents during POC meeting,
- e. Prepare resolution of the Council and the minutes of the meeting;
- f. Prepare and submit semestral MPOC Accomplishment Report to the NPOC, through the PPOC and RPOC Secretariats,
- g. Prepare and submit quarterly MPOC Secretariat Accomplishment Report to the NPOC, through PPOC and RPOC, Secretariats;
- h. Monitor municipal peace and order situations and submit a quarterly report the NPOS, through PPOC and RPOC, Secretariats;
- i. Monitor functionality of the BPOC and submit annual Functionality Report;
- j. Provide technical support or assistance to CLIP, PAMANA, Regional Task Forces, and other programs concerned with peace and public safety of the municipality; and
- k. Perform such other task as may be directed by the Council;

However, incase of MLGOO's absence due to other official functions or approved leave of absence, the Secretariat can be headed by the PNP.

SECTION 5. SPECIAL ACTION COMMITTEES DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES. There shall be a Special Action Committee on Anti-Insurgency and Anti-Criminality, Public Safety and Crisis Management who shall act on matters requiring immediate attention and decision. It shall be composed of the following, viz;

5.1 SAC on Anti-Insurgency

5.2 Duties and Functions of SAC on Anti-Insurgency

- 5.2.1 Identify specific PPPSAs that will prevent and counter insurgency
- 5.2.2 Identify the point persons or agencies who will take the lead for every anti insurgency PPPSAs identified.
- 5.2.3 Propose cost of implementation, anticipated timeline, and other factors pertaining to the activities.
- 5.2.4 Initiate and implement all ELCAC initiative and all related activities.
- 5.2.5 Frame each activity as part of a comprehensive approach.
- 5.2.6 Submit identified anti-insurgency and ELCAC activities to the POPS Plan TWG for inclusion in the POPS Plan.
- 5.2.7 Implement and monitor the POPS Plan funded PPSAs.
- 5.2.8 Closely coordinate with POC Secretariat relative to the implementation of identified activities.
- 5.2.9 Submit the following reports to the POC Secretariat and POPS Plan TWG:
 - a. Semestral accomplishment report, submit not later than 15th day of August for 1st Semester and 15th day of March for the 2nd Semester.
 - b. Annual Report, not later than 15th day of March.
- 5.2.10 Perform such other task as may be directed by the Council.
