**REORGANIZING AND STRENGTHENING THE MUNICIPAL ANTI-DRUG ABUSE
COUNCIL (MADAC) OF THE HAGONUY, DAVAO DEL SUR**

WHEREAS, the Constitution mandates the promotion of a better quality of life of the people; substantiated by Section 16 or the General Welfare Clause of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that Local Government Units shall, within their jurisdiction, promote health and safety, improve public morals, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants, among other equally significant responsibilities;

WHEREAS, the proliferation and used of illegal drugs hinder the overall efforts aimed at promoting community's peace and harmony and meaningful local development;

WHEREAS, the DILG Memorandum 2012 – 94, dated May 21, 2012 the establishment of the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC) in this municipality is imperative to be strengthened in order to have integrated approach, orderly planned and well-managed campaign in eliminating the proliferation and use of all forms of illegal drugs towards promoting and maintaining peace and order in the locality.

WHEREAS, the DILG-DDB Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2018-01 provides for the implementing Guidelines on the Functionality and Effectiveness of Local Anti-Drug Abuse Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FRANCO MAGNO CALIDA, Municipal Mayor of Hagonoy, Davao del Sur, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the reorganization and strengthening of the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC) Functionality.

Section 1. COMPOSITION. The Municipal Anti-DRUG Abuse Council (MADAC) shall be composed of the following:

Section 2. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. On the part of the MADAC Chairperson shall attest the certification declaring the “drug-cleared” status of an affected barangay, certified by the Local Chief of Police and validated by the PDEA Regional Director.
- B. Monitor the BADAC and BAT’s names, address and other significant details, copy furnished the DILG Field Office;
 - (1) Enjoin all Barangays to submit within ten (10) days from its creation the names addresses, and other significant details of all members of BADAC and its BADAC Auxiliary Team (BAT);
- C. Receive the consolidated information report from BADAC Chair;
- D. Review the consolidated reports of cluster leaders for final consolidation and submission to PDEA;
- E. Maintain list endorsement or referral of Barangay Duty Officer as to who are drug dependents for screening using ASSIST;
- F. Establish one-stop-shop facilities where assessment, interview, counseling, referral, and/or processing of applications may be undertaken.
- G. Designate a focal person who shall ensure the compliance and enforcement of DDB Regulations on Voluntary Surrender of Drug Users and Dependents;
- H. Ensure that PWUDs who surrendered shall undergo screening in order to determine the level of risk and/or morbidities and refer them to the appropriate intervention;
- I. Designate certain personnel as the authorized representatives of the DDB who shall cause the processing and filing of petitions for confinement of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered for treatment and rehabilitation before the Regional Trial Courts pursuant to Sections 54 and 61 RA 9165;
- J. Organized the MADAC Drug Reformation Committee and adopt the program of Instructions for Drug Reformation Program.
- K. Provide for the Community-Based Rehabilitation and After-Care Program (CBRAP) (with ADAC-Reporting System focal persons) and designate its Focal Person;
 - (1) Lead in the formulation of the plan of action for community based treatment and support services on the promotion and prevention of drug abuse in communities in coordination with other members of the network of the LGU.
 - (2) Monitor all IEC materials on the campaign, “Sa DROGA Talo Ka, ACHIEVE ang PAGBABAGO!” to be adopted by primary care facilities in advocating for the promotion and prevention of drug abuse in communities, as approved by DOH Health Promotion and Communication Service with DOH DDAPTP and concurred in by DDB;
 - (3) Submit the reports of Data on Community-Based Treatment and Rehabilitation and Data on Drug Treatment, Rehabilitation and Aftercare of Drug Treatment, Rehabilitation, and Aftercare Drug Dependents thru the Anti-Drug Abuse Council Reporting System (ADAC-RS) as integrated Drug Monitoring and Reporting Information System (IDMRIS) of DDB;

Section 3. DESIGNATION OF THE ADAC-RS FOCAL PERSON. RSW,OIC-MSWDO Marilyn F. Blancaflor and MHO Romeo P. Gamalong, Jr. shall be designated as the ADAC-RS Focal Persons with the following functions:

- (1) Endorse names of two (2) encoders who shall assist in recording information in the system.
- (2) Encode the necessary information on PWUD who surrendered in accordance with the Community-Based Treatment and Rehabilitation Monitoring Form.
- (3) Ensure the monthly submission of reports.
- (4) Ensure the accuracy and confidentiality of data.

- (5) Ensure that data of all PWUD who surrendered to authorities from July 2016 to December 2017 be encoded in the system following the schedules.
- (6) In case there is no person who surrendered for the month, report the same to the DDB through e-mail.
- (7) Report problems encountered in the ADAC-RS by filling out the Issue Report Form

Section 4. SECRETARIAT. The PNP Chief of Police will act as Head Secretariat of the MADAC with his station personnel as support staff.

Section 5. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. The MADAC Secretariat shall:

A. Collate all reports and maintain periodic on barangay drug-clearing operations for evaluation/analysis and continuing and procedures:

- (1) Submit all quarterly reports to the PADAC not later than 10th day of the ensuing Quarter, copy furnished the Local Peace and Order Council and DILG Field Office;
- (2) Provide technical assistance to the MADAC on its regular functions.

Section 6. MADAC Drug Reformation Committee. There shall be a Drug Reformation Committee to be composed of the COP-MPS, MLGOO, MHO, MSWDO, Volunteer Counsellors, Punong Barangay and CBRAP Focal Person who shall converge to keep track the implementation of the CBRAP Program.

Section 7. MADAC Funding. As mandated by Executive Order No. 250 dated May 24, 2000, the funds for the projects and programs or activities of the Council shall be charged against the Peace and Order Program (POP) intended for illegal drugs subject to the existing rules and regulations and shall automatically becomes the allocation for Local Anti-Drug Plans of Action (LADPA) of the Municipality which primarily includes funding in implementing for the CBRAP.

Section 8. MEETINGS.

- (1) Regular Meetings: The Council shall conduct regular quarterly meetings every 2nd Friday of the 3rd month, together with the MPOC.
- (2) Special/Emergency Meetings: A special or emergency meeting may be called upon by the chairperson when deem necessary as the need arises, anytime.

Section 9. REPEALING CLAUSE. All orders and issuance that are inconsistent with this order is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 10. EFFECTIVITY. This shall take effect immediately.
